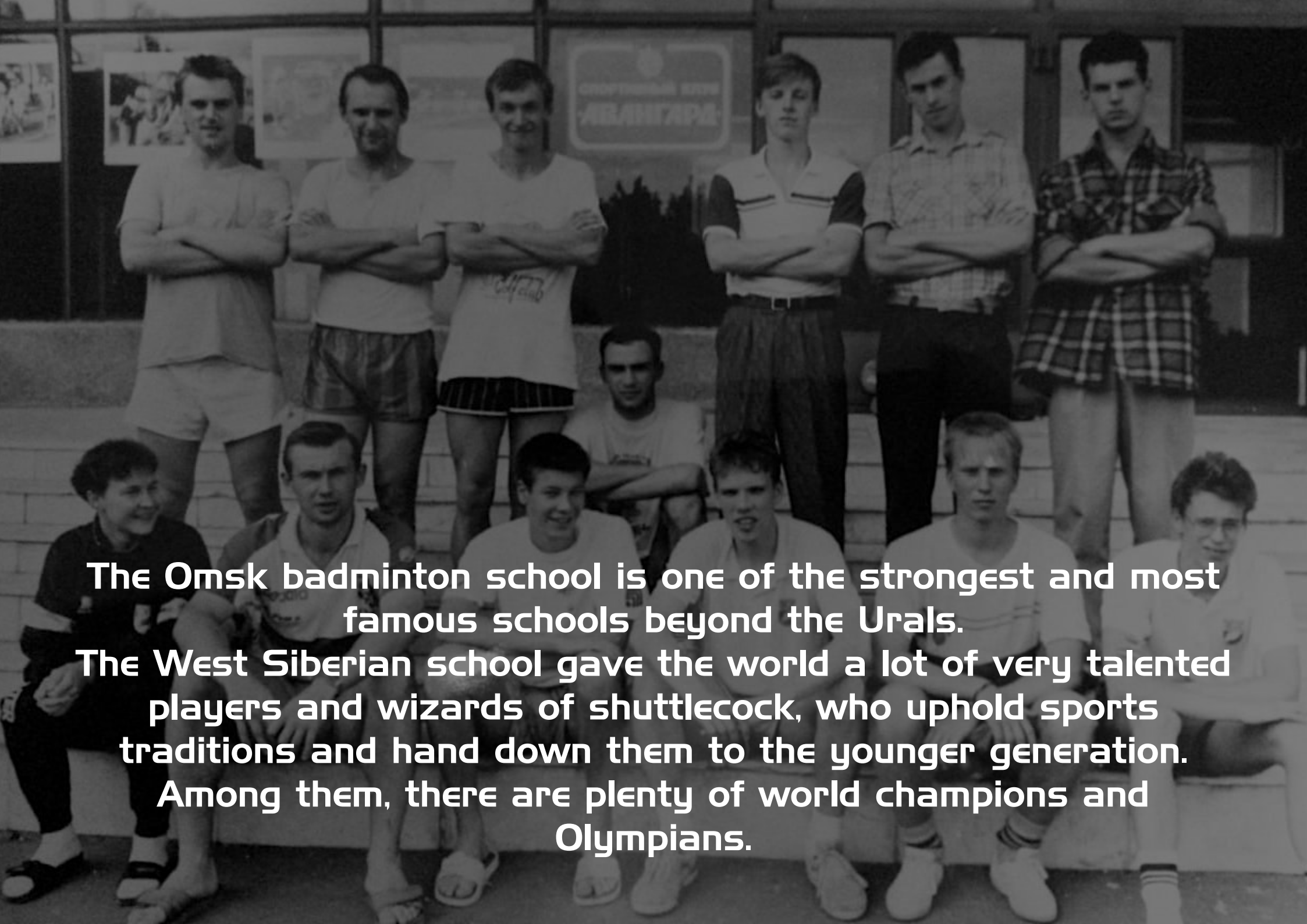

The Omsk badminton school is one of the strongest and most famous schools beyond the Urals. The West Siberian school gave the world a lot of very talented players and wizards of shuttlecock, who uphold sports traditions and hand down them to the younger generation. Among them, there are plenty of world champions and Olympians.

Historical reference

The sports school was opened on September 1st, 1973. One of the most memorable pages in the school's history started in 1976 and is associated with the Honored badminton coach of Russia Vladimir Kusmich Suvorkin.

Thanks to his hard work and professional competence, this kind of sport grew extremely popular and the first results weren't long in coming. On November 29th, 1982, the school opened a new department devoted to badminton. The department's graduates, such as Vyacheslav Elizarov, Natalya Malysheva, Vyacheslav Beresnev, Eugenia Andreeva, and others, became multiple winners and runners-up of Russia and USSR championships, as well as different international competitions.

The most successful of them was Andrei Antropov, an international master of sports. He took part in 89 international competitions, including 2 Olympic games (1992 in Barcelona, Spain, and 1996 in Atlanta, the USA), 5 world championships and cups (bronze medal in 1995), 4 European championships (bronze and silver medals in 1988 and 1994 respectively). Andrei was ranked the country's No 1 in tennis for more than 10 years – he is USSR eight-time champion with 23 medals, including 19 gold in singles, doubles, and mixed doubles. In 1988, the Omsk team won the European Champions Cup. More prestigious awards were added to the collection of the Omsk badminton school by such athletes as Sergei Melnikov, Igor Novikov, Vyacheslav Nazarenko, Alexey Popov, and many others.



For training highly-skilled athletes, in 1986 Suvorkin V.K. was awarded the title of Honored Coach of the RSFSR and the medal “For Labour Valour”.



After Suvorkin left for the national school of higher sports skills, the school's success and achievements were connected to his students Stratenko V.N. and Badamshin M.O., who became coaches and honorably followed in the footsteps of their teacher.

New names appeared: Mikhail Safronov, Yuri Sidorov, Elena Kovalenko, Olga Pavlenko, Olga Galkina, Evgeniy Sidorov, Sergei Bochkarev, Andrei Kuleshov, Elena Vasyutina, Sergei Krivtsov, Alexei Petrushin, and others. The list of Europe Youth Championship winners was added with Evgeniy Nazarenko, Evgeniy Kovalenko (1991 in Norway), and Olga Galkina (1995 in Wales). In 1993, Evgeniy Nazarenko and Evgeniy Kovalenko won bronze medals at the Europe Championship to add them to their gold medals.



Every year, athletes of the badminton department bring medals from Russian national competitions. From 2001 to 2003 alone, the following athletes became winners of the most competitions in Russia: Irina Makushina, Maria Petrova, Alexander Sokolov, Anton Ivanov, and Ekaterina Kovaleva. Moreover, Ekaterina Kovaleva won the bronze medal in the final event of the first summer Youth Spartakiad in 2003.

Effective work with children was done by coaches Kalinnikova N.F, Krasnova E.O., Galkina O.V., Badamshin M.O., Skakovski E.R., and Stepanov I.Y. In 2008, students of the school won 14 medals in different competitions in Russia and abroad.

Among them are Diana Niyazova, Elizaveta Pyatina, Vadim Khrukov, Nikita Danilov, and Nikita Dunaevski. In 2011, winning traditions were maintained by Yulia Vasilieva, Maria Panina, Evgeniy Koshman, Egor Krasnov, and Dmitri Bochkarev.

At the U13 Russia championship, the Omsk region team was ranked third, while Yulia Vasilieva won two silver medals in the individual event. In the same year, at the U11 competition, Evgeniy Koshman won the bronze medal in singles and the silver medal in doubles with Egor Krasnov.

Talking about younger students, the most successful is Yulia Vasilieva, who is a multiple winner and medalist of Russian national and international competitions.

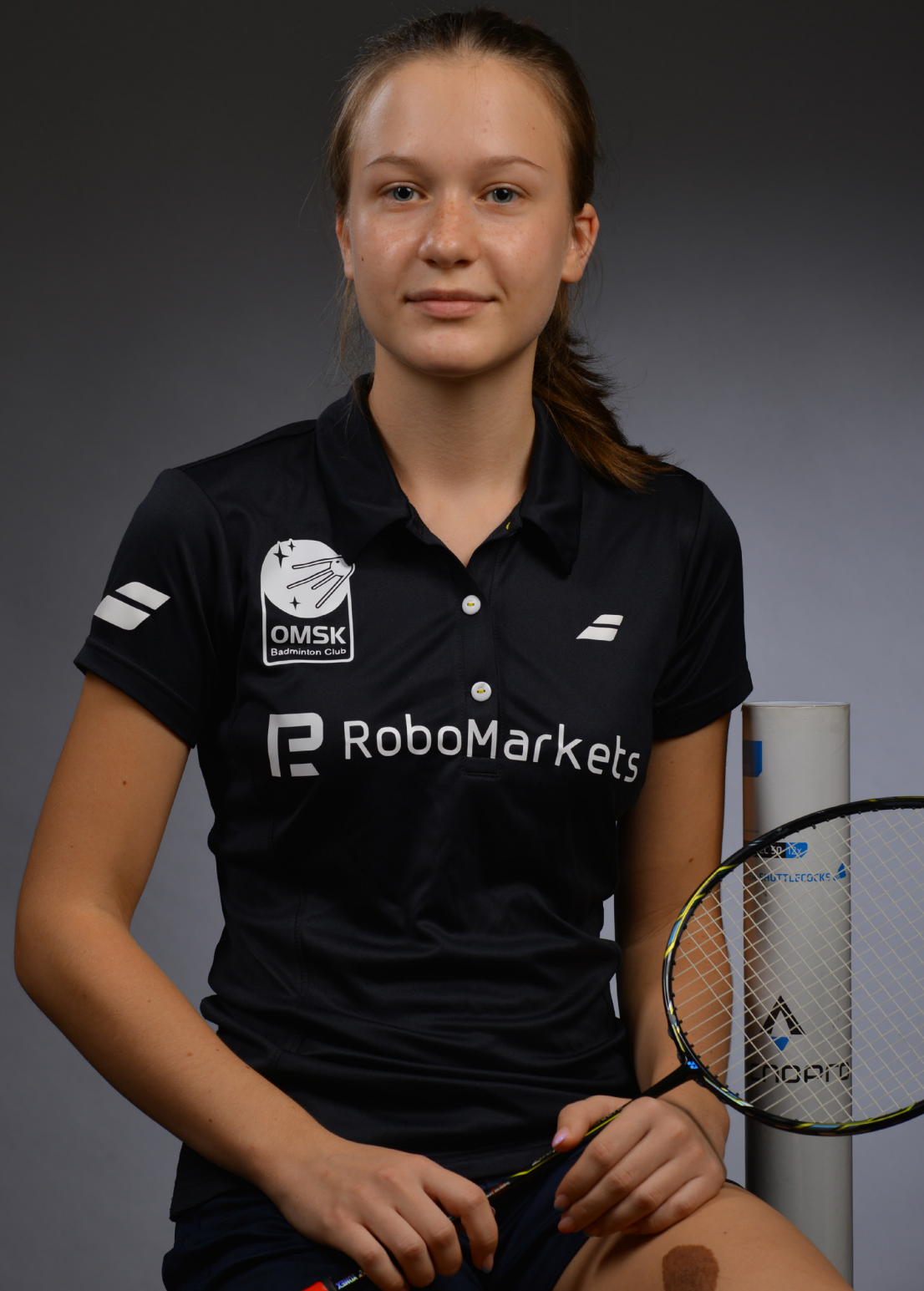

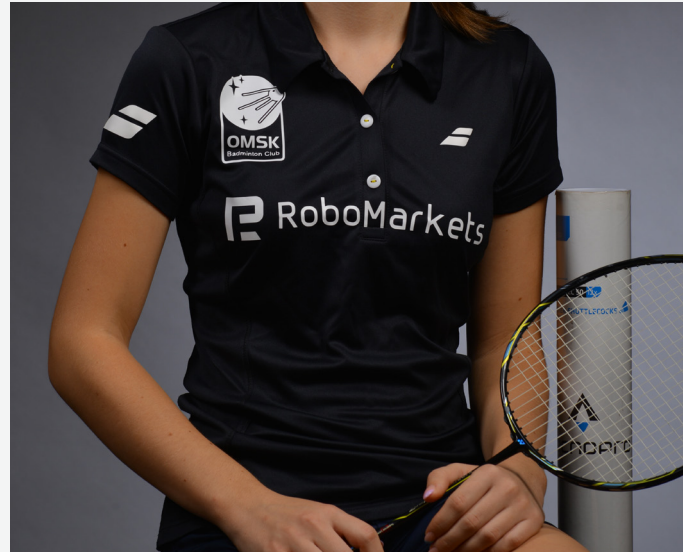
